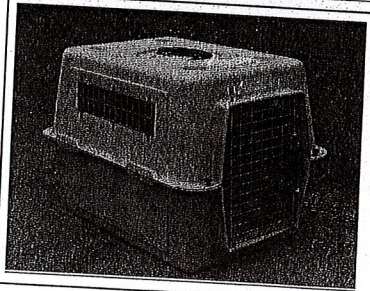


Humane Society: Project Shelter

The photo below shows part of the Society's property. Right now, this space is used for well-trained dogs to play and run with a volunteer. The red lines show the end of Society property. Beyond those lines is protected state land. No structures can go beyond this line, and the landscape cannot be changed.

We believe the property is large enough for up to 20 dog crates while still meeting the Society's other needs. The high temperatures make it hard for dogs to stay out here. The director tested the temperature of a crate on a warm, sunny day. The crate heated to an unsafe temperature. The Society needs a way to cool the crates.



A donor has given the Society 20 crates, like the one in the photo. Any changes to cool the crate must not block the entrance to the crate. There is no power outside, so any changes cannot use electricity. There is access to water, but the dogs cannot be wet. Few people will want to adopt a wet dog. The Society would like to be able to add and remove crates to the space as needed, so all changes must be made to each crate, not to the space as a whole.
